

We covered a range of incredible topics this year. Nick lead lessons on how to be a good friend and choose good friends, never giving up on your dreams, goal setting, owning up to your mistakes/responsibilities, self reflection, how to have courage, and so much more! Our Director David taught on how to get a job and financial literacy. Our mentor Tucker and Director Vanessa, taught the boys about careers in Science, Technology, Mathematics, and Engineering through a Mission to Mars program that concluded at the beginning of the year. Our mentor Chase leads a tutoring session via Zoom for our high school students three days a week. Our other mentors had many group discussions about how to apply for a job; how to have responsible, non-destructive fun; and even broached topics about current events like war and gun violence.
